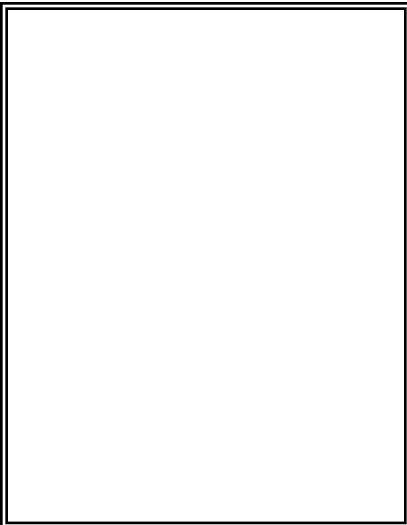

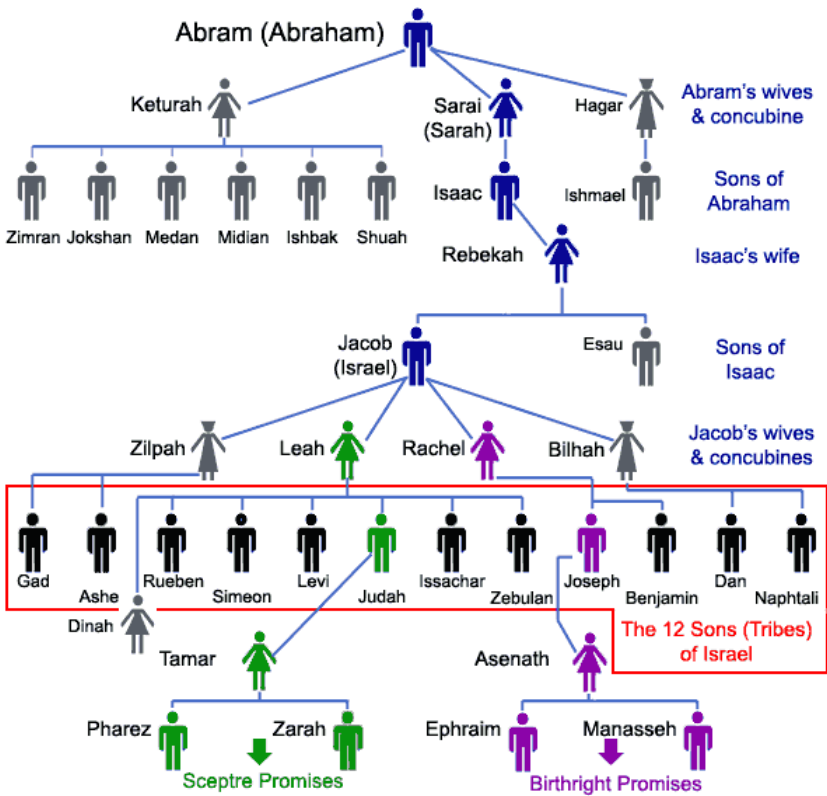

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How to start a relationship with God:

- 1) Admitting that you, like everyone else, are in need of rescue.
- 2) Asking God to forgive your sins.
- 3) Saying YES to God by trusting Jesus as Savior & Lord.

You can do that right now by simply talking to God in a prayer like this:

***Dear Lord Jesus, I know I am a sinner, and I ask for Your forgiveness. I believe You died for my sins and rose from the dead. Today, I receive you as my Savior; and I put my faith in you as my LORD. Help me to look to you and follow you all the days of my life.
In Your name, Amen.***

:: *What did God do in response to those moments? Why?*

:: *How can their experience help us in our own waiting spaces?*

:: *Pastor Shawn said, “The only one who can thwart God's purpose in your life is you.”*

:: *Discuss what that means.*

:: *Identify some implications of that reality in our daily choices.*

:: *Share a time you saw that happen in your life or someone else's.*

:: *In what area(s) of your life are you currently most tempted to focus on asking “what if...” rather than simply declaring “even if...”?*

:: *What is the next thing God is inviting you to do to move past asking “what if...” to declaring “even if...”?*

:: *Identify 1 person you can ask to pray for you as you step out and do that.*
