
Week 2 - Baptism

Acts 2:38

³⁸ Peter replied, "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit."

RITE: (noun)

a formal or ceremonial act or procedure prescribed or customary in religious or other solemn use.

OBEDIENCE.

Matthew 28:18-20

¹⁸ Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me."¹⁹ Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

**Baptism is FAITH
in action.**

Galatians 3:26-27

So in Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith, for all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ.

Baptism acknowledges God's CLAIM on our lives.

Romans 6:3-4 (ESV)

³Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? ⁴We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.

but POSTURE.


Romans 6:11 (ESV)

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How to start a relationship with God:

- 1) Admitting that you, like everyone else, are in need of rescue.
- 2) Asking God to forgive your sins.
- 3) Saying YES to God by trusting Jesus as Savior & Lord.

You can do that right now by simply talking to God in a prayer like this:

***Dear Lord Jesus, I know I am a sinner, and I ask for Your forgiveness. I believe You died for my sins and rose from the dead. Today, I receive you as my Savior; and I put my faith in you as my LORD. Help me to look to you and follow you all the days of my life.
In Your name, Amen.***

:: When/Where was it?

:: What was significant or memorable about it?

:: What difference has it made in your life or not? Why is that?

:: Review the components and symbolism of baptism. Why is it important?

:: Reread/Review Romans 6:3-4, 11.

:: What stands out to you in these words?

:: Discuss the realities/implications of being spiritually dead? Alive?

:: What are tangible ways people "walk" in new life in Jesus?

:: What does that say about the significance of baptism?

:: Pastor Shawn said, "Baptism is not about perfection but posture."

:: Why is it important to prioritize right posture, over perfection, in our baptism journey?

:: What does it look like to make baptism about perfection in our lives?

:: Why do we/others end up doing that?

:: What posture does Jesus want us to take in approaching him in baptism & life? [ref. Galatians 3:26-27, Romans 6:11]

:: Take time to talk to God about your own journey in baptism and to also pray for those who took that next step of obedience this past weekend.
