

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### Prayer of the People

Throughout "Our Heritage," we are inviting the entire Heritage family to participate in what some traditions have called "Prayers of the People." These prayers provide an opportunity to connect with God in one heart and voice even as we disperse through the week.

This week, reflect and pray through this prayer out of Psalm 146:6-10:

***This week, reflect and pray through this prayer out of Psalm 146:6-10:  
Lord, you are the Maker of heaven and earth, the sea, and everything in them— you remain faithful forever. You uphold the cause of the oppressed and give food to the hungry. You, O Lord, set prisoners free, give sight to the blind, lift up those who are bowed down, and love the righteous. Lord God, you watch over the foreigner and sustain the fatherless and the widow, you frustrate the ways of the wicked. You reign forever, King Jesus, for all generations. We praise You, O LORD.***



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## **How to start a relationship with God:**

- 1) *Admitting* that you, like everyone, are in need of rescue.
- 2) *Asking* God to forgive your sins.
- 3) *Saying YES to God by trusting Jesus as Savior & Lord.*

You can do that right now by simply talking to God in a prayer like this:

***Dear Lord Jesus, I know I am a sinner, and I ask for Your forgiveness. I believe You died for my sins and rose from the dead. Today, I receive you as my Savior; and I put my faith in you as my LORD. Help me to look to you and follow you all the days of my life. In Your name, Amen.***

:: *Where would you place yourself on the Missional Continuum diagram? What shifts would you need to embrace to move more to the left on the ranges?*

:: *Pastor Beth invited us to live on mission together. What are some personal implications of living like that? What specific invitation do you need to embrace this week?*

:: *How is your life demonstrating being a ‘good news’ person?*

:: *Identify one thing you believe God may be asking you to do next?*

:: *Take time to pray & ask God to give you courage to be on mission with Him.*
